### **Prospectus for Admission to M.Ed Programme**

**(For 2023 Admission Only)**

M.Ed programme (4 semester) is designed to provide opportunity for students to extend as well as deepen their knowledge and understanding of education, specialize in select areas, and also develop research capacities leading to specialization in either elementary education or secondary education. The purpose of M.Ed programme is to prepare professionally committed and competent teacher educators, curriculum developers, educational policy analysts, supervisors, school counsellors, school Principals, educational administrators, and educational planners who can develop education according to the national aspirations and global trends. It seeks to prepare educational experts capable of generating knowledge and to find solutions to the problems and issues relating to the theory and practice of the varied fields of education. It also focuses on comprehensive and integrated professional development of personnel engaged in educational management and administration.

#### **I. Programme Regulations**

##### **I. 1. Conditions for Admission**

##### **I. 1.2. Eligibility:**

Candidates seeking admission to the M.Ed programme shall be required to have passed the following programmes with at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade.

**a) B.Ed degree of 1 or 2 years duration recognised by University of Calicut**

**or**

**b) 4 year integrated teacher education degree programme (B.El. Ed/ B.Sc. Ed/ B.A. Ed) recognised by University of Calicut\*,**

**\*(In case of Integrated degree programmes B.Sc.Ed/B.A.Ed, aggregate marks/ grade in Education Papers alone will be considered )**

A Master's degree is not mandatory for entry in the M.Ed programme. However an additional weightage shall be given to candidates with post- graduate degree in Sciences/ Humanities/ Social Sciences

Relaxation in the marks will be allowed in the case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes/ Socially and Educationally Backward Classes/ Persons with disabilities and other applicable categories as per the rules of State government.

**II. Reservation Criteria** : Seats are reserved for Persons with Disabilities (PwD) and candidates belonging to SC (see Annexure-IV), ST (see Annexure-III), SEBC (see Appendix-V) & EWS categories as per the reservation principles of Government of Kerala as adopted by the University of Calicut. Percentage of reservation for each Category in Department of Education of University of Calicut/ Government/ Aided/ Self-financing Colleges is detailed below .

**II.1. Reservation of seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwD):** 5% seats are reserved for PwD candidates.

### **II.2. Economically Weaker Sections. (EWS)**

The seats for EWS will be filled by the University in all affiliated colleges (In all institutions which do not have minority status and permit reservation to other backward classes) from the registered students belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) who are not covered under existing scheme of reservation for the Scheduled Caste, the Scheduled Tribe and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

Anthyodaya Annayojana (AAY), Priority House Hold (PHH) certificate (see Annexure-I) /Income and Asset certificate with applicant's family income 4 lakhs or below (see Annexure-II) issued from Village Officer/ Tahasildar should be produced by the candidates who wish to avail of reservation under EWS category at the time of admission. Documents like ration card will not be accepted for availing reservation to this category.

### **III. Mode of Selection and Weightage of Marks**

Criteria for selection and method of admission to Merit/ Management seats for M.Ed programmes conducted by University Department of Education/ Government/ Aided/ Self Financing Colleges affiliated to University of Calicut shall be governed by the rules and regulations framed by the University.

In all matters related to selection and admission, the decisions of the University shall be final. The students admitted by affiliated colleges violating the above regulations will not be eligible for registration to University Examinations and contravention of the regulations shall lead to suspension / withdrawal of affiliation.

#### **IV. Selection of candidates will be based on the following criteria:**

The total marks obtained for the qualifying Examination (calculated out of 1000) shall be the basis for selection .

An additional weightage shall be given to the candidates with Post Graduate Degree (MA/ M.Sc./ M.com) in the respective area of specialization. The weightage shall be of 15 marks for those having first class with distinction/ 10 marks for those having first class/ 5 marks for those having second class and 3 marks for those having a pass in the respective Post Graduate Examination. 15 marks weightage will be given to students who secured B.Ed Degree from University of Calicut.

Weightage of 5 marks for every year of approved teaching experience in Govt./ Aided / Recognized institutions such as Elementary Teacher Training Institute or in an Elementary/ Secondary/ Senior Secondary School subject to a maximum of 25 marks. 1 year continuous service in corresponding scale alone will be considered. The weightage shall be given on the basis of an Experience Certificate in Form IV signed by the Headmaster/ Principal which is countersigned by an authorized Official Signatory such as the AEO/DEO/DDCE/DHSE/DVHSE etc.

#### **V. Admissions**

M.Ed admission in affiliated training colleges for the academic year 2023-24 will be conducted through allotment and admission to Department of Education University of Calicut will be conducted through rank list as per the admission schedule published by the University.

#### **Number of Options:**

Candidates can opt maximum number of colleges of their choice, on priority basis from among the department and affiliated colleges. Candidates who desire to take admission under community quota seats available at aided colleges shall specify the same at the time of online registration. Community quota seat eligible for candidates among their options will be considered for community quota admission.

#### **V.1 Mandatory Fee**

- For SC/ST/OEC/Communities eligible for educational concessions as is given to OEC : **Rs 125/-** (Rupees One hundred and twenty five only)
- For other category candidates : **Rs 510/-** (Rupees Five hundred and ten only)

(List of OEC/Communities eligible for educational concessions as is given to OEC candidates are appended as Annuxure-VI)

The candidates receiving first allotment or subsequent allotment should remit the Mandatory Fee prescribed. The mandatory fee need to be remitted only once. The candidates failing to remit mandatory fee will lose his/her current allotment and they will not be considered for further allotments. The candidates admitted through modes other than allotment should also compulsorily remit mandatory fee.

Mandatory fee comprises of the following:

1. Sports Affiliation fee : Rs.295/-
2. University Union fee : Rs. 90/-
3. Allotment fee : Rs.125/-

The candidates who took admission in Department of Education through rank list should remit the following fees, along with other fees at the time of admission.:

1. Sports Affiliation fee : Rs.295/-
2. University Union fee : Rs. 90/-

**V.2. Permanent Admission;** The candidates receiving allotment for the first option and those candidates who are satisfied with the allotment received in any of the allotments can take permanent admissions to the respective colleges.

**V.3. Admit Card:** Admit card will be available for all candidates received allotment and intending to take permanent admission. The college and course to which allotted, admission date and certificates to be produced at the time of admission will be specified in the admit card. All the candidates who received allotment to their first option and those candidates are satisfied with the allotment received can take admit card and report for permanent admission. There will be “no” admit card for temporary admission.

Admit card will not be available for candidates admitted to the following category of seats.

1. Management Quota
2. Lakshadweep Quota

**V.4.** There will be two general allotments, unless otherwise specified for admission of M.Ed programme.

**V.4.1** All the candidates who have received first option in the first allotment should take permanent admission. Candidates who have received option other than first option in the first allotment should take either permanent or temporary admission. Candidates failing to take admission after first allotment will be removed from the further admission process.

**V.4.2** All the candidates receiving second allotment should take permanent admission in the respective colleges. The candidates satisfied with the allotment received during first or second allotment shall cancel all their higher options and take permanent admission. All other candidates waiting for higher options shall take permanent admission without cancelling their higher options. Candidates failing to take admission after second allotment on permanent basis will be removed from the further admission process.

**V.5. Post Allotments Activities:** Candidates who received allotment should report for admission as per the date earmarked in the schedule at the college concerned after remitting the University mandatory fee. The candidates should produce the documents listed in item VII below, **in original** before the Principal of the college at the time of admission for verification. The admitting authorities shall physically verify the original documents at the time of admission, in the presence and of the student and return them immediately after satisfying themselves about their authenticity and veracity, keeping attested copies for their record (U.O.No. 11428/2018/Admn Dated, 29.09.2018).

## **VI. Fee**

Fee structure will be published prior to admission in the website.

## **VII. Essential requirement at the time of admission**

1. Printout of online application form
2. S.S.L.C/Equivalent Certificate to prove Name and Age
3. B.Ed/ Other Qualifying Examination Mark list and Certificate to prove Educational Qualifications
4. P.G. Mark list and Certificate to prove weightage (if any)
5. Service Certificate in Form IV (duly signed by competent authority) to prove service weightage(if any)
6. EWS certificate for eligible candidates (issued by Revenue Authorities.)
7. Caste certificate for SC/ST candidates
8. Non-Creamy Layer Certificate / Community Certificate for eligible candidates
9. Disability Certificate for Physically / Visually Challenged Candidates
10. Admit card for those who got admission through allotment.

## **VIII. Duration of the Programme**

The M Ed degree programme shall extend over a period of two academic year comprising of four semesters. The maximum duration permissible for taking the degree course is fixed as 3 years. The minimum number of working days in each semester shall be 100 and in each year shall be 200 excluding days of admission.

## **IX. Attendance**

A candidate shall be permitted to appear for the end semester examinations only if he/ she satisfies the following requirements.

- He/She maintains not less than 80% attendance in the total number of working days in each semester for theory and practical and not less than 90% attendance for internship.
- Shortage of attendance shall not be condoned more than twice during the entire course. Candidate who is not eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the semester by seeking readmission.

## **X. Registration for each semester**

All the courses carrying credits should be compulsorily attended by all the candidates for the successful completion of the course. Only such candidates are permitted to register for the End Semester University Examination. Every candidate should register for all subjects of the End Semester Examinations of each semester. A candidate who does not register will not be permitted to attend the End Semester Examinations. He/she shall not be permitted to attend the next semester. A candidate shall be eligible to register for any higher semester, if he/ she has satisfactorily completed the course of study and registered for the examination of the immediate previous semester. He/ she should register for the semester before the stipulated date. University will notify the starting and closing dates for each semester.

## **XI. Procedure for completing the course**

A candidate shall be required to complete the M.Ed programme after undergoing the prescribed courses of study for four semesters within a period not less than two years and clear all the examinations prescribed and fulfill all such conditions as prescribed by the University from time to time. However the maximum duration permissible for taking the M.Ed programme is fixed as 3 years after joining the programme. A candidate shall not be allowed to improve the marks already obtained. However cancellation and reappearance along with the regular examination will be permitted.

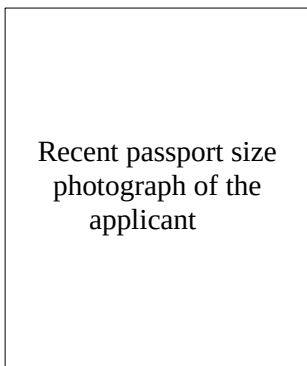

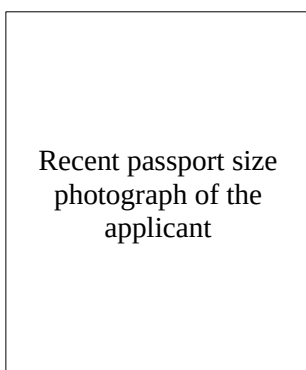
